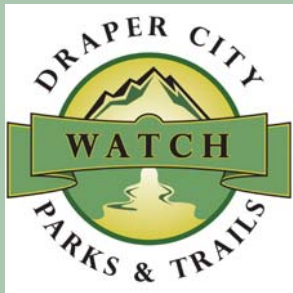


Corner Canyon Regional Park

Welcome to Draper City's park in the mountains. This land was purchased for the residents of Draper by Draper City in 2005. We invite Utah residents and visitors to explore our Corner Canyon Park. The park covers 1,021 acres of pristine, mountain trails.



A Corner Canyon Citizen Watch group has been organized to educate park visitors and to report any problems.

Draper trails are open to all non-motorized use. Be

courteous and be safe. Be aware of your surroundings. Demonstrate respect for others. Let us all be good stewards. A trail map and copy of the master plan for the park can be found online at www.draper.ut.us

Important rules to remember

- ◆ Camping is not allowed.
- ◆ No smoking or camp fires. The threat of wildfires is real!
- ◆ No hunting or trapping within park boundaries.
- ◆ We ask that you Leave No Trace: take only photos, leave only foot prints.
- ◆ Park Hours: 6:00 am to 10:00 pm, unless otherwise posted.

- ◆ Dogs by ordinance must be on leashes and the owner is responsible to pick up and properly dispose of waste. Dogs must not be allowed to harass wildlife or other trail users!



- ◆ No motorized vehicles allowed (licensed vehicles are legal on the upper road when the gates are open). Off-road vehicles damage plants, grasses and leave ruts.



- ◆ Prohibited use: paint ball games, drug and alcohol use, disturbance or removal of plants, animals or geologic features, swimming or wading in waterways or commercial activities.

- ◆ Please stay on approved trails. Be aware that cutting corners, making new trails, using deer trails or muddy trails all lead to erosion. Approved trails are engineered. Grades are kept under 10%. Attention is paid to drainage.

Trail Safety Tips

- 1) Select a trail that matches your conditioning.
- 2) Let someone know where you are going and when you plan to return. Line up a hiking partner if possible.
- 3) Dress in layers and always bring rain gear to prepare for changing weather. Avoid cotton clothing, which insulates poorly when wet and dries very slowly.
- 4) Make sure your hiking boots fit properly to avoid blisters and sore spots.
- 5) Bring an adequate supply of water with you on your hike, bicycle ride or horseback ride so that you do not become dehydrated.
- 6) Do not drink water from ponds or streams unless you have treated it first by boiling, filtering or using purification tablets.
- 7) Bring along the ten essentials of hiking:



A map, compass, water, extra food, rain gear and extra clothing, first aid kit, knife or multi-purpose tool, flashlight, sun screen/sun glasses and cell phone.
